#### **ACTIVITY 1:**

## DIRECT AND INDIRECT /REPORTED SPEECH (upravni i neupravni govor)

Good morning, children. Today I am going to talk about reported speech. We have mentioned it before. Can you remember which type of sentences we have already talked about? That's right! **Reported commands and requests**. Let's revise!

What is direct speech?

#### What is indirect or reported speech?

<u>Direct speech</u> (upravni govor) repeats, or quotes, the exact words spoken. When we use direct speech in writing, we place the words spoken between quotation marks ("") and there is no change in these words.



Mr Bellows says: "Mobile phones are banned in most schools." – DIRECT SPEECH

<u>Indirect or reported speech</u> (neupravni govor) – we don't repeat the exact words spoken, we report them (we retell them to another person).



Mr Bellows says that mobile phones are banned in most schools." – REPORTED SPEECH

We can report statements, commands, requests and questions.

REMEMBER: The pronouns and possessive adjectives change in reported speech:

Jack: "I will sell my house."

Jack says that **he** will sell **his** house.


Reported commands and requests:

- to report commands, we use the verb **tell(s)/told** + **to** + **infinitive:** Jack says to Tom: "Hurry up!"- Jack **tells** (**told**) Tom **to** hurry up.
- to report requests, we use the verb ask(s)/asked + to + infinitive:
   Mary says to me: "Help me, please!" Mary asks/asked me to help her.
- to report negative commands, we use **tell(s)/told +not to + infinitive:**Jack says to Tom: "Don't be late!"- Jack **tells (told)** Tom <u>not **to** be</u> late.
- to report negative requests, we use the verb ask(s)/asked + not to + infinitive:
   Mary says to me: "Please don't run!" Mary asks/asked me not to run.


#### **ACTIVITY 2:**

# REPORTED STATEMENTS AFTER VERBS IN THE PRESENT (izjavne rečenice u neupravnom govoru uz glagole u sadašnjosti)

We use reported statements to say what somebody says or thinks. We can use the verbs say, tell, think.



\*THAT can be omitted: Tom says he likes ice cream.



AFTER 'TELL' WE MUST USE THE PERSON'S NAME OR AN OBJECT PRONOUN
